

Pope St. Pius X, Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto, was born in Riese, Kingdom of Lombardy-Venetia, present-day Italy. The second of ten children in a poor and devout family, he learned the Catholic faith by word and example. Impressed by Giuseppe's piety and intelligence, his parish priest paid for Giuseppe's education at the gymnasium of Castelfranco Veneto and later secured a scholarship for him to the Seminary of Padua. He was ordained a priest on September 18, 1858 at age twenty-three.

After ordination, Fr. Sarto served for eight years as an assistant priest at the parish in Tombolo, often fulfilling the elderly pastor's duties. Fr. Sarto served the poor, taught adult education classes, and trained the parish choir in Gregorian Chant. In his spare time, he studied St. Thomas Aquinas and canon law. In 1867, he became Archpriest of Salzano, with responsibilities over the entire territory. He restored the dilapidated church, expanded the Catholic hospital, and cared for the sick during a cholera outbreak.

At age forty, Fr. Sarto was elevated to Canon of the Cathedral at Treviso, Chancellor, and Vicar General. He also became spiritual director of the diocesan seminary,

where he was devoted to priestly formation. He continued to teach catechism and reached out to the poor and needy.

In 1884, Pope Leo XIII named Canon Sarto as Bishop of Mantua. Finding indifference and secularism, Bishop Sarto invigorated the laity's education, taught in the seminary, and reintroduced St. Thomas Aquinas' theology and Gregorian Chant. In 1893, Pope Leo XIII appointed Bishop Sarto as Patriarch of Venice, naming him a cardinal. The Patriarch brought the same priorities to Venice. In 1903, the sixty-eight-year-old Bishop Sarto was elected Pope Leo XIII's successor. Pope Pius X's motto was "To restore all things in Christ" (Ephesians 1:10). A pastor at heart, he was humble, loved teaching children, and cared for the poor. He introduced a universal catechism, reformed the curia, renewed seminary formation, revised the Code of Canon Law, revitalized the liturgy, encouraged Gregorian Chant, and emphasized Saint Thomas Aguinas' teachings.

His love for children led him to lower the age for First Holy Communion from twelve to seven, encouraging children and adults to receive the Eucharist frequently. His death came just weeks after the start of World War I. He became the first pope to be canonized since Pope Saint Pius V, who died in 1572. - *mycatholic.life*

Reflections on the Readings

You Are What You Eat

Proverbs 9:1-6

You are what you eat. People who reflect on their diet learn a lot about themselves. They discover their passions and temptations. They learn what they will not tolerate and what they cannot avoid. They discover the effect their choice of food has on others. It may hurt the family farmer and help global distributors.

People who do not eat healthy food pay a price more dear than the grocery bill. You are what you eat.

The Book of Proverbs envisions divine Wisdom as a woman who has prepared a lavish meal. She has built a house and spread a table within it. She invites to this table not those who are hungry for physical food but those who are simple. Those who lack understanding may come to this meal.

Those who dine at Wisdom's table nourish their mind, not their belly.

The meal we share at church is small: a bit of bread, a sip of wine. But this food and drink is much more. It is the Body and Blood of Christ, the source of all wisdom.

When we make the Eucharist a part of our lives, we grow in wisdom. We make room for God.

When we eat the Bread of Life, we become what we eat. We are the Body of Christ.

Wise Up

Ephesians 5:15–20

There are always ways to improve your skills. If you play bridge, you learn by joining a club. If you play music, you learn with a good teacher. If you play sports, you learn by watching the pros and practicing under the tutelage of a good coach.

If you want to improve your life as a Christian, there are many ways to learn. Books, newspapers, and journals abound for those who learn by reading. Prayer groups are helpful for those who learn by devotion and conversation.

Lectures are available for those who like to hear the personal testimony of a gifted speaker. We have lots of opportunities to learn about our faith.

Without more understanding, we stagnate in misperceptions, and we become susceptible to false teachings.

The Letter to the Ephesians expressed concern that its Christian readers were not learning enough. "Watch carefully how you live," it says, "not as foolish persons but as wise." We all have opportunities to learn, but not everyone seizes them. "Do not continue in ignorance," the letter says, "but try to understand what is the will of the Lord."

God loves us and desires our friendship. We can develop our relationship with God and the church in the same way we do any other interest. We read, we listen, we converse, and we make time to unfold the gift of faith we have received.






