

### Reflections on the Readings

#### **Trusting God's Ways**

If you resist God's will, you are doomed. There are things you want. There are situations you wish would go your way. Sometimes you can arrange to make that happen. Sometimes other people suffer for it. Sometimes they benefit because your vision is actually quite good.

But sometimes your way is not God's way. You may not agree with God's way. You may think God is making a mistake. You may think your idea is better and that God should listen to you.

But God has a plan. It is a mysterious plan. It is a plan incomprehensible to humans. And sometimes God's plan is not your plan.

"Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh," God says through the prophet Jeremiah. Trust in anything that is not divine, and you will be a barren bush in the desert str

you will be a barren bush in the desert, standing in a lava waste, salt, and empty earth.

It will not be pretty. But if you trust in God, you are blessed. You are like a tree planted beside waters with roots stretching to the stream. Your leaves will stay green. You will bear fruit even in drought.

But it may mean giving up the things you want and accepting what God wants.

#### **Our Most Important Belief**

Easter is the most important day in the year. Not everyone feels it. A lot of people treat Christmas with more importance. Or Valentine's Day, or Independence Day, for that matter. But Easter tops the Christian calendar.

The reason, of course, is the meaning of the Resurrection. Our belief in life after death directs everything we do. We live not as citizens of this world but as citizens of heaven. We go about our daily tasks, but with one eye fixed beyond the horizon to a world yet to come. We believe we are forgiven and that a new home awaits us.



In Paul's day, some of the Corinthians were having a problem with this. They questioned the resurrection of the dead. They suspected that death ended life, and that was that. Some of them believed Jesus had risen from the dead, but they did not go the next step, believing the same would happen to his followers.

To Paul, it made no sense. He wrote to the Corinthians, "If Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead?" The resurrection meant everything to Paul. "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain."

With the Resurrection of Christ comes forgiveness of sins and the resurrection of the dead. It is our firm faith. And it's why Easter is the biggest day of the year.
