

And he got up and followed him" (Matthew 9:9). Immediately after Matthew abandoned his occupation, he invited Jesus to dine at his house and Jesus accepted.

Dining with them were other tax collectors and sinners. The Pharisees condemned Jesus for associating with these men. Jesus rebuked them: "Those who are well do not need a physician, but the sick do. Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous but sinners" (Matthew 9:12–13).

Throughout the rest of the Gospels, Matthew's name is listed with the Twelve. He was present at the Ascension and Pentecost. Early Church Fathers state he remained for some time in Judea, preaching the Gospel and helping the newly formed Church. He may have penned his Gospel during this period.

St. Matthew's most enduring gift is his Gospel, which early Church Fathers attribute to him unequivocally. His Gospel was written for his fellow Jews, likely in Hebrew and Aramaic and later translated into Greek. It shows Jesus as the fulfillment of the Old Testament, the long-awaited Messiah. He begins with a lengthy genealogy tracing Jesus' roots to Abraham, the father of the Jewish nation. The Sermon on the Mount portrays Jesus as the new Moses, offering the New Law on the new mountain. Moses received the Law from God on Mount Sinai while the Son of God gives the New Law on the Mount of the Beatitudes.—my catholiclife.org
