Vincent de Paul was born to peasants in France. Highly intelligent, he grew up working the fields and tending the livestock. A devout child, Vincent was ashamed of his poverty and longed to rise in society. His father sold an ox to finance Vincent's education at the Franciscan seminary in Dax. Later he studied theology at the University of Toulouse and was ordained a priest. There he completed his studies in theology and canon law, paying for school by tutoring. In 1604, Fr. Vincent traveled to Marseilles to sell property he inherited. On his return, pirates intercepted his boat, killing some onboard and injuring everyone else, including Fr. Vincent. The survivors were taken to Tunisia and sold. For two years, Fr. Vincent was bought and sold multiple times. His last owner was a Franciscan priest who had renounced his faith to win his freedom. After Fr. Vincent helped him convert back, they escaped together. Fr. Vincent's slavery transformed him. His faith deepened, as did his concern for the poor. In 1607, Fr. Vincent met Msgr. de Berulle (later Cardinal Berulle) and went to Rome with him to continue his studies. In 1609, Fr. Vincent returned to France to coordinate almsgiving for Queen Marguerite of Valois and he realized how the wealthy could help the poor.

As a pastor, he entered the wealthy Gondi family's service, giving missions to the rural populations on their properties. He ministered to prisoners who rowed in the French galley ships and formed the Confraternities of Charity, an association of laywomen who care physically and spiritually for the poor and sick.

In 1625, Fr. Vincent founded the Congregation of the Missions, later known as the Vincentians. The new congregation ministered to the poor. The Congregation of the Missions began managing seminaries and offering formation to the clergy. A century after Vincent's death, the Vincentians controlled one-third of the seminaries in France. Also in 1625, Fr. Vincent became Louise de Marillac's spiritual director, inviting her to work with the Confraternities of Charity. Fr. Vincent and Louise discerned that wealthy women could help with fundraising while a new congregation cared for the poor. In 1633, they co-founded the Daughters of Charity, dedicated to serving the poor in soup kitchens, hospitals, schools, orphanages, job training, and prison outreach. Fr. Vincent spent 27 years expanding the Daughters of Charity, Confraternities of Charity, and Congregation of the Missions; all were thriving at the time of his death in 1660. —*my catholiclife.org*

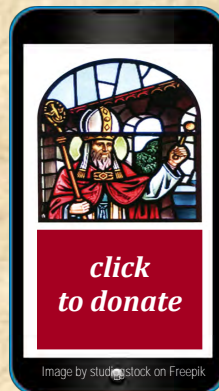

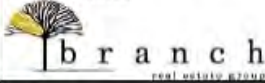

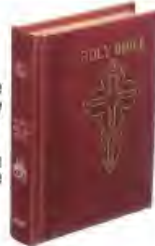
